Kerredge Gallery January Exhibition: Animal Life, Art from the Kalevala This community exhibition will be on display in the Kerredge Gallery until February 2nd. View work inspired by the Kalevala. The Kalevala is a 19th century work of poetry compiled by Elias Lönnrot from Finnish and Karelian oral folklore and mythology. It is regarded as the national epic poem of Finland and is one of the most significant works of Finnish literature.

# It's Not Just Black & White: Photography Portraits by Glenn Ierley Kerredge Gallery: February 6-March 2, 2019

Twenty stunning photographs in black and white by local photographer, Glenn Ierley will be on display through March 2. His acute attention to detail and the sensitive nature of his photographic sittings are timeless. Glenn's work meets somewhere between photojournalism, high art, and the starkness of a 1970 high school graduation picture. He shared this quote by Ted Grant that he found inspirational, "When you photograph people in color, you photograph their clothes. But when you photograph people in black and white, you photograph their souls." He will also give a presentation on "A Color Restoration of a 1915 Photograph of Village Women from Russia" on Friday, February 15th from 6-7:30pm. This is an amazing story about what it takes to accurately restore color to an image taken before color film existed. Please join us for this presentation and his opening reception on Friday, February 8th from 6-8pm.
