In addition this year, local artists will be demonstrating various fiber arts techniques 10am to 2pm. Demonstrators include Gini Brewer, knitting and crochet; Cynthia Cote, beadwork; Jenny Lester, spinning; Victoria Shaffner, knitting and crochet; Hannah Smith, needle felting; Joyce Koskenmaki, hand stitched sculpture; and Karen Tembruell, basketry techniques. The event will be upstairs in our ballroom. Please use the door on Tezcuco Street. Look for directional signs on the day of the event.
