Remembering Jan Manniko a lifetime of painting the Copper Country Kerredge Gallery August 10-September 10, 2022

This special exhibition includes an eclectic collection of paintings that span five decades in oils, acrylics, watercolor and colored inks. All work is for sale.

The volume of paintings that Jan Manniko produced in her lifetime is phenomenal and encompassed a breadth of medium and style. Many people knew Jan or at least knew of her. She and her husband Tom owned and operated The Last Place on Earth, the large red building on 41 north of Calumet where they tag teamed keeping the shop open displaying and selling glass bottles, copper specimens, antiques, Tom's hand carved wooden spoons and Jan's artwork. The Last Place on Earth was also her studio where she always had a painting in progress. Here she worked on complex and expressive still lifes including plants and objects d'art as she referred to them. When she was not in the shop she was outdoors, often walking along the highway but also set up and painting plein air in fields, among mine buildings, and at the lake shore. Jan documented the history of the area, its people and events and the physical landscape. She preserved in her way that which changes, buildings fall down, events take place, people go away and that which changes ever so slowly, the shoreline, the turbulent lake, the soft meadows and the deep woods.

Jan passed away in 2013. We are grateful to her family for making this artwork available. She is truly a Copper Country treasure. artists, members, volunteers, students, patrons, and champions. Executive Director Cynthia Coté shares how the Arts Center found its home.

"I remember standing on the sidewalk with Mayor, Mary Tuisku, Board Member, Phyllis Fredendall, and Grant Project Director, Stephen Albee. We wiped away the grime on the window of this piece of prime real estate to peer inside at the abandoned clutter, makeshift offices, bad carpeting, pegboard, and paneling. "It's perfect!" said the visionaries. Mary secured a manageable lease and we set to work with a cadre of volunteers to clear the debris, paint the walls and install clamp on shop lights to make a suitable gallery space. That was November 1992. By the Fall of 1995, under the leadership of Board President, Kathy Tompkins, the wheels were in motion to make a purchase agreement with the Kerredge family and to launch a capital campaign to begin the first phase of renovations. Two years later we had another major campaign to fund the second phase of renovations making the entire first floor functional space with a stairway to the second floor. Since
