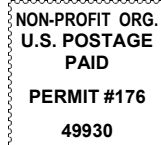

**Birds I've Seen by Tammy Santti Kero, June 6-30, 2017**

"My current artwork series is the production of small, colorful acrylic paintings of birds - a subject that always reminds me of my mom, sisters, and childhood. Birds are something seen every day and sometimes taken for granted. (Not until I started preparing for this exhibition did I realize just how many birds visit my own yard.) Too often, we fail to take time from our busy lives to appreciate and experience the little moments of joy we can from something as accessible and prevalent as the sight of a bird. Likewise, we often fail to make time for family and friends, when just a phone call or quick visit could make a positive difference.
