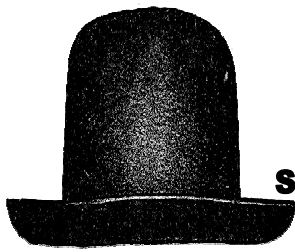

Lake Superior is both inspirational and animate in Stella Larkin's life and art. The synchronicity of her life-art-lake existence is evident as she walks Lake Superior's shore and paddles its tributaries collecting driftwood, which is the foundation for her art. Born in Cincinnati, OH, raised in Lower Michigan, Stella has been charmed and fascinated by the powerful body of water outside her sauna door. Through this consciousness, Stella has fashioned a quiet, relatively self-sufficient, life in Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

Recent work by Stella Larkin includes driftwood and metal landscapes, fiber art totems and mixed media assemblage. Stella lives in Marquette and earned her BFA in Fiber Arts from Northern Michigan University in 1990.

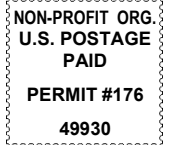
MURAL PROJECT UPDATE
