KERREDGE GALLERY EXHIBITION

Art Installation by Terri Jo Frew

Many of Terri Jo Frew's concepts are manifest primarily as large-scale drawings in charcoal and ink. Their content is drawn from her subconscious, primarily addressing themes such as feminism, nature, the occult, Canadiana, and humanity's shadow side. Their execution is immediate and the size brings life-sized figures and animals directly into the viewer's space. Her work can often seem eclectic in description, however it is the unifying themes that bring it all together. Drawing is therapeutic and the theme of "process and the journey" is the focus of this installation. The work in this exhibition spans from 2008 to the present.

Terri Jo Frew earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts in studio arts from the University of Western Ontario in London, Ontario and her Master of Fine Arts degree in fibres concentration from Concordia University in Montreal, Quebec. Since moving to the area she has been on the Visual and Performing Arts Faculty at Michigan Tech and taught youth, teen and adult classes at the Copper Country Community Arts Center.
