How the Other Half Lives by Jacob Riis

Book discussion with Stephanie Carpenter and Allison Neely Thursday, September 12 from 6:30-7:30

Join us for a discussion of Jacob Riis's ground-breaking book *How the Other Half Lives* (1890). Our focus will be on Riis's verbal and photographic imagery. Riis saw himself as a social reformer, and his work influenced housing and public health reforms. But this

isn't the only work that the book does. Questions we might consider include: How does the book depict "the other half"-and who is included (and excluded) from that category? How does Riis encourage us to see the subjects of his book? What parallels can we draw between Riis's presentation of new immigrants and urban poverty and depictions that we see today? Stephanie Carpenter (Humanities faculty, MTU) and Allison Neely (Archivist, MTU) will facilitate the discussion. Participants are encouraged to view the exhibit prior to the book discussion-and to read the book! Copies of How the Other Half Lives can be purchased from the Calumet Visitor Center.
