
POOR ARTISTS SALE Market NOV 28-DEC 23

Grant Awards

We are grateful to the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs for the following grant awards: Operational Support: \$18,750 Regional Regranting Program

for the Western UP: \$49,500

For the Regional Regranting Program, we are granted \$16,500 for our Administrative costs. The remaining \$33,000 is awarded to other community organizations and individual artists through these grant programs: Arts Projects; Professional and Organizational Development; School grants for Art Supplies & Equipment and Bus grants for travel.

MCACA Grants for Schools

Two new programs have been added to our Regional Regranting Program: Bus Grants for up to \$500 and Arts Equipment & Supplies Grants for up to \$1500. Applicants must be an accredited Michigan preK-12 educational institution, public or non-public school, private school, home school, school district, intermediate school district/regional educational service agency or an accredited Head Start program. Activities must take place between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.

The next deadline for Arts Projects and Professional and Organizational Development Grants is January 15, 2021 for projects taking place March 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021. Application guidelines are available on line at https://www.michiganbusiness.org/industries/mcaca/mcaca-grants/ (scroll down to Minigrant Program). All applications must be submitted online using SmartSimple. Registration instructions for SmartSimple are included with the grant guidelines.

The School Grants have an open deadline up until April 16, 2021 and need to be used by June 30, 2021.
