




CCCAC Kerredge Gallery August Exhibition TRYING TO STAY SANE IN AN INSANE WORLD

In her artist statement Heidi Frair Bresnahan says, "The body of my work was produced between 2008-2018 as a therapeutic outlet while caring for my elderly parents in my home and raising two teenagers as a single mom. Without any formal training, I simply dipped a brush in acrylic paint one day and got started on a journey that amounted to 150+ paintings. Frequently I come up with a title first and then try to create a painting to match. (The titles are a vital part of understanding the message of



my paintings). I have always used insufficient brushes and inexpensive, dried up paints (my dad taught me to be extremely frugal). My paintings have made people laugh out loud and occasionally cry which makes me think I am on to something." Heidi was born in Hancock, Michigan in 1960. Her lifelong passion for the arts started at a young age, given that her parents were Paul and Audrey Frair (active members of the arts community in Houghton for nearly 40 years). She graduated in 1991 with a B.S. in occupational therapy but her career of 37 years has been as a massage therapist. She has lived in many parts of the country from California to Maine and is happy to be settled again in Houghton after 52 years of being away.





We are fortunate to have a wonderful selection of unframed plein air acrylics, colored inks, and botanical paintings by Jan Manniko in our sales gallery. It has been a pleasure working with Jan's brother Phil and his daughter Lynne as they work through and make decisions about the large collection of artwork by Jan who passed away the summer of 2013. Jan was an early and long-time member of the CCCAC. She was a prolific artist who studied at the Chicago Institute of Arts and learned from local artists, Peder Kitti and Alden Steck. She has played an important role in documenting the Copper Country's people, industry, and the natural world in her distinctive expressive style. The more than 60 pieces that we have for sale have never been shown and are part of a very special extensive collection of works over her lifetime.
