★ COLLABORATIVE POETRY LETTERPRESS PRINTING WITH DANIEL SCHNEIDER TUESDAY, MAY 16 FROM 4-6PM

In the tradition of William Shakespeare and William S. Burroughs, students will write lines of verse. In the tradition of Walt Whitman and Virginia Woolf, students will set their own lines of type by hand. In the tradition of the French surrealists, students will assemble their lines of type in random order and print an edition of exquisite corpse poetry broadsides. **Register by May 9th.**

★ SUMINAGASHI WITH BONNIE LOUKUS THURSDAY, MAY 18 FROM 4-6PM

Students will learn about materials and techniques to create Japanese marbled paper. Suminagashi or "floating ink" is a calming practice of creating concentric circles, like tree rings, of ink floating on water. Paper is placed upon the final design to pull a finished print. **Register by May 11th.**

★ PAMPHLET BOOKS WITH BONNIE LOUKUS TUESDAY, MAY 23 FROM 4-6PM

Students will learn how to make 2-3 basic pamphlet books using quality paper and materials. Pamphlet books don't require any glue and are easy to modify after learning the basic structure. **Register by May 16th.**

★ ILLUSTRATION WITH TERI FREW THURSDAY, MAY 25 FROM 4-6PM

Illustration is an important part of book arts, especially narrative illustration- most commonly seen as the main illustration style in comic books and graphic novels. Students will learn the basics of creating characters and storylines, using storyboards, the arrangement of text, and more in this exciting class. **Register by May 18th.**

★ LETTERPRESS PRINTING: BIG-LETTER POSTERS WITH DANIEL SCHNEIDER

Tuesday, May 30 OR Thursday, June 1 from 4-6pm

Make new art with old machines. Students will work together to print posters with bright-colored ink and big wood type letters on the '47 Vandercook Proofing Press. Each participant will take home three posters: one to keep, one to share, and one to hang up somewhere outside. **Register by May 23.**

★ COMIC WORKSHOP WITH PAMELA KOTILA TUESDAY-THURSDAY, JUNE 13-15 FROM 1-4PM

Students will make comics! This is a nine hour workshop, which is long enough to make a comic of about two to four pages. Through a hands-on approach and individual instruction, students will learn the basics of how comics work and tricks behind using all the tools at your disposal to help tell your story. **Register by June 9th.**

★ SCI-FI & FANTASY ILLUSTRATION WITH PAMELA KOTILA JUNE 21 & 23 FROM 6-8

Students will make fantasy illustrations by constructing a fantastic scene that includes landscape, setting, buildings, & characters. Visual narrative and some compositional tips will be given during the demonstration, and individually as the students create their work. **Register by June 14th.**

7TH ANNUAL BOOK ARTS CAMP AUG. 7-11, 10AM-3PM

This is a unique opportunity for students in grades 8-12 to study bookbinding, creative writing, zines, paper marbling, letterpress printing, and block printing.
