Kerredge Gallery: Wires

A film and sculpture installation by Kristine Granger, May 8-31

Kristine Granger is an interdisciplinary artist who investigates memory. Her artwork invites the viewer to reflect on the indelible recollections that define our own realities.

In her statement Kristine refers to the concept of layers of existence that make up who we are inspired by a childhood visual memory: "...I struggled to understand that events, whether positive or negative, had to be accepted and seen as creating my existence. It is a theory that I have continually nurtured and dissected. The layer of living: the construction and destruction of self that is necessary for growth. This is a process that is articulated for me best through the creation of my work."

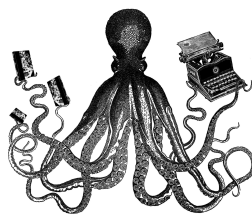
Kristine Granger earned her Master of Fine Arts degree and Women's Study Certificate from Stony Brook University, NY in 2010. She completed her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree, focusing in Photography, from University of Oregon-Eugene, School of Architecture and Allied Arts in 2005. She is Art Faculty and Fine Arts Coordinator for Bay College in Escanaba MI. She is the owner of Rock Street Studios in Marquette where she currently resides.

MCACA Mini-grant Program

The next grant deadline for 2019 project funding is August 3, 2018. Arts Projects grants fund up to \$4000 with a 1:1 cash or in-kind match. Professional and Organizational Development grants fund up to \$1500 matched 25% with cash or in-kind contributions.

The CCCAC is the administrator for the Regional Re-granting program of the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs, facilitating funding opportunities for arts projects in the six counties of the Western Upper Peninsula; Baraga, Gogebic, Houghton, Iron, Keweenaw, and Ontonagon. Free mini-grant workshops will be offered in June throughout the Western UP. 33rd annual Summer Arts Camp: Register early!

Spots in camp are already beginning to fill up! Our 33rd annual Summer Arts Camp is five fun days of art making for youth entering 3rd-6th grades. Students will experience a week of projects focused on a variety of mediums including drawing, painting, pinhole camera photography, fiber arts, writing, journal making, ceramics, and more! The fee is \$110 if registered and paid by July 3rd; \$125 after. The deadline to register is July 28th, but camp typically fills several weeks before our final deadline. **Register early!**
